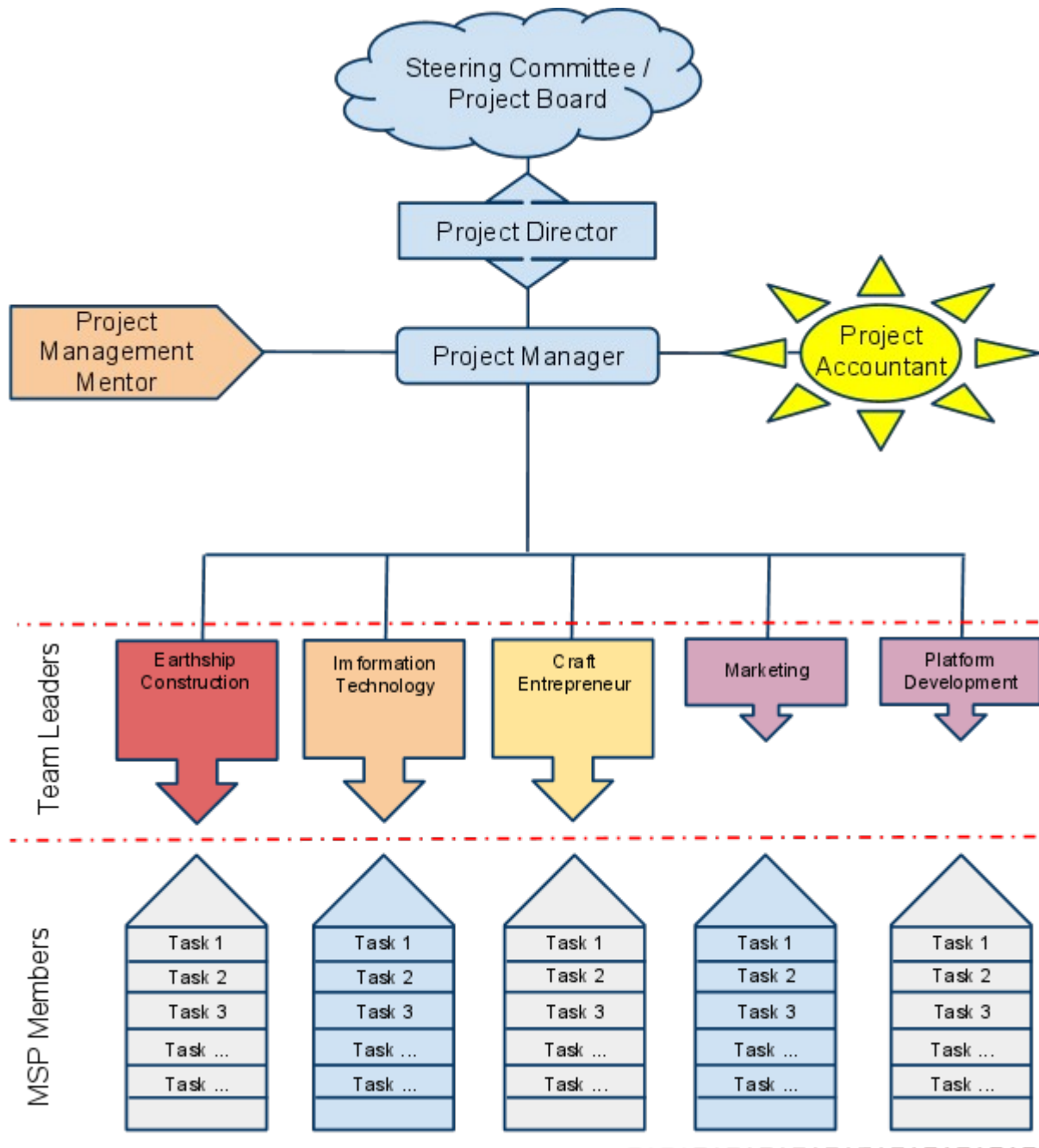


Team Structure

MSP Project Platform

Information Technology has unleashed vast technological changes that have profound implications for the way in which society can organize itself making it possible for any individual with access to internet to take part in the global movement of change.

The MotherShipProject Team will be supported using modern ICT's (Information and Communication Technologies). A project platform will be developed where individuals from any where in the world can register and join the MSP Team. All project related information will be stored in the project database/platform and could be accessed by new MSP members to get up to date with the project status. This will decrease the dependance on a fixed project team and make it possible for anyone to play a part in an exciting project.

Tasks will be broken down into manageable easy to complete tasks with due dates, resources needed and related information to complete the required task. Team Leaders will be assigned to each department. Team Leaders will be responsible for assisting, guiding and mentoring members who checked out tasks in their department. The following departments has been identified and as the project evolves other departments will be added as needed.

Roles

Steering Committee / Project Board

The group of people charged with regular oversight of the project. Collectively they represent all significant areas of participation in the project and they would have authority to take decisions on behalf of those areas. Members would be Team Leaders, the Project Manager, Project Director, along with external representatives. The Project Director and Project Manager would normally report to the Steering Committee.

Project Director

The person with genuine executive authority over the project. The Project Director has full accountability and responsibility for the project's success, and has the power to make all decisions, subject to oversight by the executive bodies.

Project Manager

The person with day-to-day responsibility for the conduct and success of the project. The Project Manager will have control over all project resources.

Project Management Mentor

A person nominated to assist/advise the project manager and provide project management oversight to the project.

Project Accountant

Responsible for dealing with procurement, managing finances, progress tracking and financial reporting etc.

Team Leaders

Typically the project will be divided into various sub-teams - each with its own Team Leader. Team Leaders would be responsible for the management and coaching of that sub-team. They also have responsibility for managing and tracking the detailed sub-plan for their team.

MSP Team Members

Will be volunteers from all around the world who has joined the platform and willing to assist in the development of MSP. They would be responsible for the tasks checked out and will need to report any difficulties and outcomes to the Team Leader of the individual department by logging all task progress on the platform.

Developer / Programmer

A specialist in the creation of solution components responsible for the development of the MSP Platform.

Marketing Specialist

A specialist in marketing. Where the solution has an external element, it is important to consider how to make it attractive to the external people and bodies concerned. In particular with eSolutions, such considerations will form a fundamental part of the design of the solution rather than just an exercise following the completion of the solution.
