Since its founding in 2000, TakingITGlobal has established itself as a key online resource for young people making a difference in their communities. It now runs the world's most popular online community (receiving 40 million hits per month), bringing together young people (aged 13-31) within international networks to connect to opportunities, and collaborate on concrete projects - addressing global problems and creating positive change. With headquarters in Toronto, Canada, TIG has expanded its membership to include over 85,000 youth, speaking 209 languages in over 200 countries and territories around the world.

For this specialized United Nations agency, it is not enough to build classrooms in devastated countries or to publish scientific breakthroughs. The [salesforce.com/foundation](http://www.salesforce.com/foundation) was officially launched in July 2000 - less than a year after the launch of the company with the goal of building philanthropic programs at the very beginning of the company's existence rather than waiting until the company had reached a certain level of "comfortable success." Its belief is if emphasis is placed on social programs from a company's inception, the value of service will be a core cultural value that is built into the fabric of the company. With headquarters in the United States, the Foundation has grown to include international offices in Ireland, Japan, and Kenya.
