*\*The Hebrew "Chai" symbol of Judaism (i.e. the letters Chet-Yud or Het-Yod). This word Chai ( חי ) means "living" in Hebrew, and is related to the word for "life", Chaim.(quote from dictionary)*

*\*\*The Hebrew word "Ayin" written ע or א symbolizes "guidance", "hope" and "protection against the evil eye"*

*\*\*\* The Hebrew symbol of Hamsa (המסה) in the image of a human hand serves as protection against "the evil eye"*

**BELOW ON THE LEFT IS KANZI BONOBO'S חי SYMBOL 5 MONTHS AFTER OBSERVING ITAI ROFFMAN WRITE IT ON THE WALL, KANZI DID NOT USE PAINTS FOR HIS INTERPRETATION OF IT BUT RATHER HIS CREATIVITY, INTELLECT, ABSTRACT THOUGHT, IMAGINATION AND HIS FINGER NAIL ON PLASTIC GLUED WITH PAPER (HIS LEXIGRAM SHEET).**

**ITAI WAS NOT PRESENT WHEN THIS WAS CREATED BUT WAS DELIBERATELY PLACED BY KANZI SO ITAI COULD FIND IT LATER IN THE DAY. KANZI USED SYMBOLISM AND HEBREW WRITING TO COMMUNICATE WITH ITAI ON AN INTELLECTUAL LEVEL PREVIOUSLY THOUGHT ONLY PRESENT IN HUMANS. KANZI WANTED TO REMIND ITAI WHAT THEY HAVE DONE TOGETHER IN THE PAST – VIA HUMAN LANGUAGE: HEBREW, SYMBOLISM AND ART.**
