Jennifer Corriero Co-Founder & Executive Director

Jennifer Corriero is an innovator and leader, bringing tremendous insight into understanding, reaching and motivating youth. Jennifer's experience includes developing and driving youth programs related to technology, collaboration and entrepreneurship, and has designed and delivered an extensive range of interactive learning experiences with the aim of empowering youth as community leaders

She is the co-founder and Executive Director of TakingITGlobal, a non-profit charitable organization based in Toronto, Ontario that strengthens the capacity of youth leaders, while fostering cross-cultural dialogue and global awareness through the use of technology. With an annual budget of around \$1.5 million, the organization has 25 staff members and nearly 100 virtual volunteers, along with 8 Board Members and a network of over 30 advisors who help guide TakingITGlobal's direction. Over 220,000 young people are registered as members from over 200 countries, while the site has reached out to over 10 million people since its launch in 2000.

In 2007, Jennifer received York University's Bryden Alumni Award in the One to Watch category and was recognized by the Women's Executive Network as one of Canada's Most Powerful Women: Top 100™ Award Winners. She has been selected by the World Economic Forum as a Young Global Leader (2005) and Global Leader for Tomorrow (2002). Jennifer also had the honour of being a member of the Official Canadian Delegation on State Visit to Brazil with Her Excellency, the Right Honourable Michäelle Jean, Governor General of Canada in July 2007.

She has presented and supported civil society engagement at events including the World Urban Forum, International AIDS Conference, World Summit on Sustainable Development, Youth Employment Summit, World Youth Congress and Global Knowledge Partnership International Forum. Jennifer has been a youth engagement strategy consultant for a range of organizations including Microsoft, TD Bank, VanCity Credit Union, Ontario Science Centre and the Canadian Government.

Jennifer has been featured in articles in The Toronto Star, The Globe and Mail, The New York Times, Fast Company and TIME Magazine; was named as one of the "Shapers of Our Future" in the area of technology and education by Converge Magazine; was named one of the Top Newsmakers of 2006 in IT Business Magazine; was the 2001 Wired Woman Young Woman of the Year; has been recognized by the National Congress of Italian Canadians as a Youth Achievement Award winner; and was an award winner for McGill University's Management Achievement Award.

She has a BA (Liberal Studies) with a focus on 'Business, Communications, Technology and Culture' and a Masters in Environmental Studies from York University, with a concentration on Youth Engagement and Capacity Building Across Cultures. Her thesis project focused on leveraging the insights and experiences of youth leaders from around the world, which helped with TakingITGlobal's redefining of its Guide to Action framework, designed to provide young leaders with the tools to have a positive impact in their community. Jennifer has also directed or partnered with numerous research related to youth and online civic engagement, including Our Space (MIT Press), Local Voices, Global Vision (WSIS) and Youth Media DNA (D-CODE).



Michael Furdyk Co-Founder & Director of Technology

Michael Furdyk is the Co-founder and Director of Technology for TakingITGlobal.org, a global online community for young people, engaging hundreds of thousands of youth in over 200 countries and territories. Along with managing the technology team at TakingITGlobal, Michael is involved with the TIGed education program, and has spoken to over 50,000 educators about the importance of engaging students and integrating technology and global perspectives into the classroom.

In the past, he has turned his interest in technology into a series of successful online companies, co-founding MyDesktop.com (later sold to Internet.com) and BuyBuddy.com (which raised \$4.5-million of venture capital). Over the last few years, Michael has consulted for many Fortune 500 companies, including a 6-month engagement developing youth strategy with Microsoft in Seattle, Washington.

As one of Teen People's "20 teens that will change the world", Michael has shared his opinions about Youth Engagement and experiences as a member of the Net Generation by speaking at dozens of events, including the World Congress on IT, the US Government's National Youth Summit, Microsoft's Anytime, Anywhere Learning Summits, The Business Council, and TED. He has made numerous media appearances including The Oprah Winfrey Show, Time Magazine, Fast Company, BusinessWeek, CNN, MSNBC, and USA Today. He is a board member and advisor to numerous groups including Microsoft, Pollution Probe, the Anytime, Anywhere Learning Foundation, and several other national and global organizations.
